SPECIFIC PRAYER REQUESTS

The team also asks specifically for prayers of protection for those who God brings to Christ and what happens after that. Many of the people converted at the 2018 crusade lost their homes as family members who did not approve of the conversion set their homes on fire.

The president of India has vowed to eliminate all religions except Hinduism. It is a difficult time to be a Christian in India, therefore we ask that you **do not post anything on social media** about the team's work, for their safety. Sharing emails is fine.

Also, please be in prayer for Bibles for India. One family member may attend the crusade, and be saved, but once the crusade is over, Bibles are needed so that the person may share the gospel with the rest of his/her family. Last year over 10,000 were saved after the crusade from converts taking the Gospel home.

Please pray for the 70 church plants that arose out of the crusades and the pastors that have been in training to lead these churches. And for the churches that will arise from this year's crusade.

Please be in continuous prayer for safety, that Satan's plans to destroy the people of India would be thwarted by our Almighty God, that the government turns their hearts to Christ and for the defeat of Satan and the false gods of India.

January 2019 Devotional

Genesis 8:6-12

So it came to pass, at the end of forty days, that Noah opened the window of the ark which he had made. Then he sent out a raven, which kept going to and fro until the waters had dried up from the earth. He also sent out from himself a dove, to see if the waters had receded from the face of the ground. But the dove found no resting place for the sole of her foot, and she returned into the ark to him, for the waters were on the face of the whole earth. So he put out his hand and took her, and drew her into the ark to himself. And he waited yet another seven days, and again he sent the dove out from the ark. Then the dove came to him in the evening, and behold, a freshly plucked olive leaf was in her mouth; and Noah knew that the waters had receded from the earth. So he waited yet another seven days and sent out the dove, which did not return again to him anymore.

Patience, we all want it but we just don't want to have to wait for it. In total, Noah spent 378 days in the Ark. This includes the time that they spent waiting on the rain to begin, the flooding of the earth, the receding of the waters until the time that they could exit the ark. That is a long time by anyone's standards, especially considering the circumstances of what they were living in at the time. The ark was full of animals. Can you imagine living in a crowded barn full of animals?

During these days Noah saw God do something that was incredibly horribly amazing. He flooded the earth and killed everything and everyone that was not on the Ark. It was a worldwide judgement. Everyone outside of Noah's family was gone. The burden and loss of knowing that wrapped up in the peace and comfort of being chosen by God. It was a great moment of trusting in the sovereignty of God.

In the verses above we see that Noah now had to trust in God's timing as he waited patiently to leave the ark. In sending out the Raven, it would show Noah that there was enough to sustain a scavenger. In sending out the Dove, it would show Noah that there was life that would sustain a gentle creature that needed more than a carcass to feed on. The Dove returned with an olive leaf. The earth had come back to life. In waiting on God's timing Noah and his family were able to leave where God had placed them for safe keeping to place where they could now go and grow.

Praying that you wait on God's timing for your life today.
