I celebrate your fellowship together and I encourage any of you who have not connected with your fellow churches in going, praying and giving; this adventure is a whole lot more joyous and enriching for you and your congregation when you become an active member of the team. This year is going to be another spectacular year of obedience and fulfillment of the Great Commandment and Great Commission among us because of the faithful and strong leadership of the Spirit of Christ in us. I'm ready.



What God has appointed for you to be part of in India is absolutely exceptional. He has chosen you for this. I can't find the words to express my sense of reverence and joy over this thing that God has entrusted to you.

Regarding the latest updates: Pandu was planning to come to the United States and spend time with us in the month of March, but the government of India is not allowing Pandu to leave the country. Twice he tried to come, and he was stopped by the government.

We need to pray and fast and ask for strength for Pandu and for the new budding churches being planted in India. I encourage you to fast from one meal each week this month and dedicate that time to prayer for Pandu and the church in India. Also ask our Lord if you should give financially to Mission India. The new churches in India need Bibles and the pastors need training. You can use God's money to place the Word of God in the hands of the people of India and enable the training of elders and teachers for the fledgling churches of India.

Again, please do not post anything regarding Pandu or Mission India on any social media platform including Facebook, Twitter, etc. Through social media the Indian Government learns about our desire to partner with Pandu for the advancement of the gospel and they use that information to persecute Pandu and the church and stop us from partnering with him.

PASTORS DAY AT THE CAPITOL

Several of us attended our Pastor's Day at the Capital. Robert Jeffress was the key note speaker and spoke an encouraging word. We are called to preserve our nation as long as we are able while we shine the light of the gospel. We are salt and light.

I encourage and challenge you:

Become informed about the spiritual battles happening in our state which are being fought at all levels of government, from our school boards to our state capital.

Pastors Day at the Capitol continued from p. 2

Several issues that we heard about at our time at the 2019 Pastor's Day at the Capital are listed below. These are issues that we are addressing through our leaders at the GBMB.

RFRA REGARDING RELIGIOUS LIBERTY

It is paramount. It has moved its way to the top of our list of issues, because if we are not standing for religious freedom, then our ability to legally do missions and evangelism is going to come into jeopardy. And so, standing on religious freedom and, in particular, The Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) is of extreme importance.

I am thankful that our new governor, Brian Kemp, has made a commitment to the passage of a Religious Freedom Restoration Act. With that in mind, it is important that we as Baptists keep our governor and his wife, Marty, in our constant prayers. He's a man who knows the Lord and what is right. He's wanting to work with Georgia Baptists and all Georgians in protecting our First Amendment Rights.

SR 184 REGARDING GAMBLING

For four years we have been able to stop every single piece of gambling, from Daily Fantasy Sports to casino gambling. But I am telling you friends, I do not believe the gambling industry is ready to give up. It is going to be harder than ever before, but we are going to work to stop the expansion of gambling in our state and to protect our families from its harm.

The fact is overlooked that every \$1 raised in tax revenue from legalized gambling results in \$3 of social costs back to the community!

ABORTION

We intend to work with Governor Kemp in trying to put together a bill to stop all abortions at the time that a fetal heartbeat is detected. That legislation would begin to stop all abortions from approximately six weeks onward. This is a tremendous piece of legislation being pursued in a number of states. Georgia Baptists are working with organizations and faith leaders here in our state to support such an effort!

HB 324 REGARDING MARIJUANA

It is coming. And it is a very hard issue to deal with. We do not take a position on medical marijuana, but do on cultivation and recreational use. It is coming at us with an unbelievable force, both in our state and across our nation. We are going to try to minimize any other expansion of marijuana in our state.

HB 76 REGARDING ALCOHOL RESTRICTIONS

Most people do not understand that the detriment from the abuse of alcohol <u>is greater than the opioid issue</u> in our nation. It is being overlooked. We are trying to retain the restrictions already in our laws. Evidence shows that "if you decrease availability in any manner, shape, or <u>form it will decrease consumption</u>."

SR 55, SR 66 REGARDING PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION LAWS

These pertain to issues of sexual orientation and gender identity. These laws are going to be a tremendous detriment to our state if we are not able to stop them. Many of the laws end up being a potential source of religious discrimination.

Other areas of public policy that we are influencing: SB 45, SR 84 Pari – Mutual Betting on Horse Racing HB 418 – Hidden Predator Act HB 426, SB 166 – Hate Crimes Laws HB 228 – Marriage Ae Reduction HB 234 – Human Trafficking Enforcement

These are just some of the issues we know we will be dealing with during this legislative session. March 2019 Devotional

Exodus 4:29 Then Moses and Aaron went and assembled all the elders of the sons of Israel; 30 and Aaron spoke all the words which the LORD had spoken to Moses. He then performed the signs in the sight of the people. 31 So the people believed; and when they heard that the LORD was concerned about the sons of Israel and that He had seen their affliction, then they bowed low and worshiped. Ex. 4: 29-31

God was sending Moses to deliver the sons of Israel from 400 years of bondage. God told Moses exactly what he must say and do so that the people would believe and worship Him. This time of affliction was not by chance. God had previously told Abraham "that his offspring would be servants there and afflicted for 400 years." (Genesis 15:13). God had prepared them for what was ahead. But as we all sometimes do, we never anticipate how long or how bad our affliction will be.

But, oh what joy there must have been on that day when Moses delivered the news that deliverance was coming. A massive sigh of relief had to sweep over the people. Finally, God has heard our cries.
