

Churches Partnering Together to Accomplish the Great Commission

Summer 2019 has been good. Great ministry is taking place all around as DBA churches are engaging our communities through VBS and mission-ministry ventures. Your DBA youth and children summer camps were blessed and your mission trip to Mexico was a success by all accounts. In addition to your Great Commission work locally and around the world, our Southern Baptist Convention was very encouraging.

Southern Baptist Convention

Our Southern Baptist convention voted on two amendments that exclude from Southern Baptist life any church that: 1) hires or harbors anyone who is or has been engaged in sexual immorality of any kind; and 2) any church that tolerates or engages in discriminatory behavior and partiality based on race or ethnicity. Our Southern Baptist convention made a clear and strong stand that any church engaged in either of these behaviors is emphatically not a Southern Baptist church.

Another highlight of the convention was the introduction of the new leadership of several of our beloved entities. Adam Greenway now leads our Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Jamie Dew is giving leadership to New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, Paul Chitwood is the new lead for the International Mission Board and Ronnie Floyd is now the Executive Director of our Southern Baptist Convention. We pray that these men will lead in the wisdom and strength that our Lord provides, and that our Lord's kingdom will advance to the glory of Christ.

Children's Camp

God used your Adrian Children's Camp and Surge youth mission camp to confirm his love for our young people and grow them into the likeness of his son. Both camps had high attendance this year. Your camps are planned and executed with excellence by directors Denise Pournelle and Laura Hay who have 50 years of combined experience leading our camps. Each year at camp our young people have the opportunity to retreat from the influence of the world and taste the sweetness of a life of worship, fellowship, mission and communion with our king. Camp is a special week each year that our Father uses to strengthen our kids so that they will stay the course.

Mexico Mission Trip

The Mexico Mission trip was a huge success by all accounts. Our team of 25 from various churches in your association adopted a kingdom agenda and we're on the same page. There was no complaining and no concern about the things of this world because all we're focused on one goal, the Great Commission. We proclaimed the gospel throughout the city and many expressed a desire to receive Christ. We prayed with them that they might begin their relationship with God in Christ. We collected contact information for these new ones and provided that information to the church for a follow up. As many as 36 were counted as having prayed to receive Christ.

VBS grew from 50 to 60 on the first day to around 140 on the last day. Vida Nueva was encouraged and I'm confident their good reputation has grown in Kantunilkin. Our team and the members of Vida Nueva connected like family over the week and tears were shed as we departed. I'm confident that our Lord grew each team member into the likeness of Jesus Christ, the great missionary sent by God. By all accounts the mission trip was a great success and I anticipate a continuing partnership with Vida Nueva in Mexico. Thank you for praying. Thank you for giving. May we all be going into all the world, making disciples from our neighborhoods to the nations.

Another one of your mission teams is heading to Cherokee, North Carolina to serve God and proclaim the good news. They will be on mission July 12-19. It's time again for Annual Church Reports! We look forward to this time each year as a way for sister churches to join together to review and reflect on the Lord's blessings as we partner together to accomplish the Great Commission!

Last year 30 of our 50 DBA churches participated in filling out the Annual Church Reports.

We know it may seem like a bit of a chore, but there are numerous benefits for your church by filling out your ACRs:

In your church

- **Review accomplishments** Take time to talk with your community about the amazing things God is doing at your church. *It's a fun to be us moment!* Celebrate the positive momentum your church is experiencing.
- **Recognize people** Your church "happens" because people give time, effort and energy to it! Annual reports are a great way to thank and honor people who have gone above and beyond to make a difference in the past year.
- **Retell stories** Organizations become the sum total of the stories we tell one another. At its core an annual report is a codification of the "big story" that was written over the last year. Amplify the story you want your church to become.
- **Record for history** If annual reports are done well, they become handy tools in the future, helping you to look back at what took place at your church. As you write your church's report, ask yourself if this is the content you want to recall 10 years from now.
- **Refocus on mission** Like a "state of the union" address, an annual report is an opportunity for the leadership of the church to focus on broader themes and direction. Use this opportunity to point people toward the kind of church you want to be.

In your Association & Convention

- Your Voice Your annual report gives you a voice of participation. Don't let your voice be unheard!
- Relevancy Your report conveys the relevance of ministry. It is an opportunity to celebrate you and the vital leadership and faith witness you bring in service of Christ and the church. It highlights what is working and what is not, so that focus can be defined.
- **History** Your report contributes to the history and growth of Georgia Baptists and Southern Baptists in making Kingdom impact!
- **Praise** Your report allows us to shout specific praises to our Lord with you for the work He is doing in our counties, state, nation, and world!
- Accountability Your report is a fulfillment of your covenantal responsibility to the Association, Georgia Baptist
 Mission Board, and Southern Baptist Convention. As such, your file becomes a history of your conventional
 accountability.

How to participate

- Paper packets will be mailed via United States Postal Service to every church in the DBA by the end of July.
 These packets will include the instructions, forms, and a stamped envelope to send the report back to the DBA.
