Pray, Give, and Go

The Old Testament Festival of Sukkot or Feast of Tabernacle happens in the month of October. This is a joyful festival that God commanded Israel to celebrate each year. It is an 8-day festival in which God instructed the Israelites to dwell in temporary huts called booths or sukkahs. The Festival commemorates and celebrates God's deliverance of the Hebrew people from slavery in the land of Egypt as well as God's faithfulness to his people as they traveled through the desert-wilderness for 40 years before entering into the promised-land. In Leviticus 23:42-43 God says to Moses, "You shall dwell in booths for seven days. All native Israelites shall dwell in booths, that your generations may know that I made the people of Israel dwell in booths when I brought them out of the land of Egypt: I am the Lord your God."

Like the Hebrew people, we too have been delivered from bondage and slavery to sin and the flesh. This world is not our permanent home. We are passing through this dry and weary land as travelers on their way to their permanent home, the place which Christ has prepared for all those who place their faith in him.

As the Hebrew people traveled from slavery to the promised land, there was no food or drink in the desert wilderness. God gave them manna every morning to nourish them and he gave

them water to flow out of rocks. As we make journey from slavery to our final home, Jesus of Nazareth is our manna from heaven. He is the rock and the living water which will satisfy our thirst. We cannot live by physical bread alone, but we'll have abundant life if we feast on Christ.

Like the saints who have made the journey before us, it is good for us to remember that we are strangers and exiles on the earth.

The writer of Hebrews tells us about the saints. "These all died in faith, not having received the things promised, but having seen them and greeted them from afar, having acknowledged that they were strangers and exiles on the earth. For people who speak thus make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of that land from which they had gone out, they would have had the opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city." (Hebrews 11:13-16)

Let's fix our eyes on the kingdom of God rather than what the world offers. Let's fix our eyes on Jesus. As Hebrews 13:12-14 tells us, "Jesus suffered and died outside the city gates to make his people holy by means of his own blood. So let us go out to him, outside the camp, and bear the disgrace he bore. For this world is not our permanent home; we are looking forward to a home yet to come."


